In such an India communalism, separatism, isolation, untouchability, bigotry and exploitation of man by man have no place and while religion is free, it is not allowed to interfere with the political and economic aspects of a nation's life. If that is so, then all this business of Hindu, Muslims, Christian and Sikhs must cease in so far as our political life is concerned and we must build a united but composite nation where both individual and national freedom are its cure.
