When I regained consciousness, my environment had changed. I was in red desert. Having studied about the planets I knew that this one had to be the red planet. In other words, I was on Mars.

On my finger there was a ring with a golden triangle which glowed just like the one I had seen in the sky. It was emitting some power which helped me survive without breathing. Or else I would have choked and died, for Mars has no air. In fact, it has almost the same phenomenon which supports life on this Earth, but no human being-like beings.
