There are more literate people in India today than ever before. But there are also more illiterates than even before. More children go to school than at any time in the past. But more children today are out of school than any time in the past. but it is not enough to blame the high birth rate for the state of affairs. Indeed, it can be reasonably argued that continued mass illiteracy is not the result but the cause of the high birth rate. Consequently, spread of literacy can be a potent weapon of socio-economic development.

Unfortunately, official thought and planning in this regard has betrayed a failure of perception. The problem of illiteracy is related to but not the same as that of education. And while it is a colossal task to provide proper and full academic education to all children and youth in the country, the problem of eradicating illiteracy calls for a different and less leisurely blue print. The following measures will be in the right direction: more primary schools, new part-time educational centres for those who cannot attend regular schools and functional literacy centres for adult, especially in semi-urban and rural areas.
