 - (a) The CCS (Conduct) Rules, 1964 is not applicable to members of All India Service.
 - (b) Joint representation from Government servants should be viewed as subversive of discipline.
 - (c) Every Government servant belonging to any service or holding any post included in Group 'A' and Group 'B' shall submit an annual return.
 - (d) To participate in sports activities as an amateur, Government is not required to obtain previous sanction of the Government.
 - (e) If any question arises relating to the interpretation of CCS (Conduct) Rules, 1964, it shall be referred to the Government whose decision thereon shall be final.
 - (f) All loans, whether secured or not, advanced or taken by the Government servant are classified under movable property.
 - (g) No Government servant shall employ to work any children below the age of 14 years.
