- 1. A, B, C, D & E armed with weapons entered into Z's house in order to get forcible possession of the house. Grave injuries were inflicted on Z and his family. A shot Z with a pistol and died. C stole some jewellery from Mrs.Z and D raped Y, the daughter of Z. Discuss the liability of each member of the group involved in the case.
- 2. The fundamental principal of penal liability is 'actus non-facit reum, nisi mens sit rea' which means the act itself is not criminal unless accompanied by a blameworthy mind. Elaborate this statement.
- 3. 'The law does not expect a citizen to a rank coward or to leave his house at the mercy of a burglar'. Discuss this provision of law in regard to right of private defence.
- **4.** Write down the stages of commission of a crime with suitable illustrations and relevant case laws.
- **5.** Discuss the underlying principle of the legal maxim '*Nemo debet bis vexari pro una et eadem causa*' (a man shall not be twice vexed for one and the same cause).
- **6.** What guidelines should be kept in mind while considering bail applications under the provisions of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1973? Under what circumstances can bail be cancelled?
- 7. Describe the provisions relating to investigation by police mentioning the types of offence under the Criminal Procedure Code, 1973.
- **8.** During the course of a criminal investigation, the accused desires to make a confession. What procedure should be followed to obtain a proper confession?
- 9. Evidence may be given in any suit or proceeding of the existence or non-existence of every fact in issue and of such other facts as are hereinafter declared to be relevant and of no others. Discuss.
- 10. In certain cases the State has been given the privilege not to produce certain documents which relates to the 'affairs of the state'. Discuss the law relating to it.
- 11. What is the rationale of making a dying declaration relevant? What are the essential requirements of a dying declaration?
- 12. Discuss the underlying principle of the phrase 'res gestae' with suitable illustrations.

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
